My fellow club members,



Instead of our formal meeting in June, we will be having our 18th CWCA Show. The following is all of the details and expectations you need to know, from hours and location, to categories and prizes.

- 1. Where...The New England Carousel Museum 95 Riverside Ave. Bristol, CT 06010 860-585-5411 info@thecarouselmuseum.org
- 2. When...Saturday June 4th 2016 Entries accepted starting at 8 AM and goes to 10 AM. Please try to get entries in as early as possible so all pieces are ready for display when the doors open at 10 AM. Judging is set to begin at 10:30 AM. Entries are not to be picked up until the close of the show, AFTER 4 PM Set up for the show is Friday June 3rd from noon til 3 ish. Tables, registration area, & vendor spaces are just a few of the things we need to get ready.
- 3. Why...This show is also a fundraiser for us. We are able to keep our club dues to a ridiculously low amount as long as our show brings in enough money!! Show your support so dues are not increased, and so we have a full slate of pieces. Perhaps you would like to display a piece at our new "In progress" table also.
- 4. Who...YOU!! All club members are expected to enter at least one piece. There is a skill group for all members to enter in. Here is a definition of each one...
 - Youth- Carvers age 18 and under. These are young carvers that are just starting out.
 - **Intermediate-** These carvers are from beginner to experienced carvers who have not sold any carvings, have not won "Best in Show". These carvers typically have beginning to moderate carving skills.
 - **Open-** These carvers are very experienced. Often they have sold carvings, won significant blue ribbons or "Best in Show" or teaches classes on carvings.
 - **Instructor Assisted-** These are carvings that were done with the assistance with instructors via a class or very close mentoring.
- 5. How much...First entry is \$8, and each additional is \$5. We have many categories to place your entry in, and Judges reserve the right to reclassify the category your entry is placed in based on their expertise.
 - * abstract * caricature * carving in the round * chip * miscellaneous * relief * utility * wildlife fin * wildlife feather * wildlife fur * wood burning.
- 6. What else is there to do...There will be carving demonstrations of walking sticks, freestyle carving, wood burning, chainsaw carving, and wood turning. Also the yearly raffle, carousel rides, guided tours, carving sales, vendors with books & supplies, the museum gift shop & more!!
- 7. Unless you are entering a competition piece, entry fee to the museum is \$6 for adults, \$3.50 for kids 4-14, for which the club gets a percentage, so talk it up with family and friends so both us and the museum make out!
