If you have won a blue ribbon at this show at this level in the past, you must enter the Open level. **OPEN** These carvers are experienced. You are in this level if you have won a blue ribbon at this previous show in the intermediate level, have sold carvings, are a paid professional, or teach classes about carving



We have four competition lev • Junior-	vels based on your experience: Carvers age 18 and under. These are young carvers that are just starting out.
Intermediate-	These carvers are from beginner to experienced carvers who have not sold Carvings, have not won "Best in Show". These carvers typically have beginning to moderate carving skills. Most carvers fall into this category.
<ul> <li>Instructor assisted-</li> </ul>	These are carvings that are done with the assistance of instructors via a class or very close mentoring.
• Open-	These carvers are very experienced. Often they have sold carvings, won significant blue ribbons or "Best in Show" or teaches classes on carvings.
